A realistic plan to reuse, renew and restore Gordon Wilson Flats

You may know it as the neglected flats on The Terrace that Victoria University - Te Herenga Waka (VUW) - says it intends to demolish, but the Gordon Wilson Flats (GWF) have both history with Te Aro School and exciting options for renewal.

Gordon Wilson was a pupil of Te Aro School, then called the Terrace School, in the early years of the 20th century, becoming a government architect who designed the building which now bears his name.

With VUW stating that it could start demolition later this year, the Architectural Centre has put up an alternative plan that will deliver modern accommodation faster, with less disruption to neighbours, as well as better carbon and environmental outcomes.

VUW estimates demolition alone of GWF will take 35 weeks. This means hundreds of extra truck movements on the surrounding roads as rubble is taken to landfill, with neighbours and others having to put up with the resulting noise and traffic disruptions.

VUW has said it will replace the 11-story building with a new one, but has yet to release designs, time frames and costs including the loss of embodied carbon, the environmental impact and volumes of waste to landfill.

The Architectural Centre's plan would replace the building's façade and reuse its main concrete core to deliver modern housing and save carbon, time, waste-to-landfill and impact on the city.

The Centre's plan to renew GWF includes engineered wood, glass winter gardens (conservatories) and solar panels to provide 100 high quality warm, dry apartments to house up to 350 people with space on the site for many more. Alongside these are shared study rooms, communal lounges, and social spaces. A rooftop terrace will create a unique outdoor amenity for relaxation and play with sweeping views across the city.

This would deliver on VUW's own key priority for 'ecological thinking that contributes to a sustainable, resilient, and better world'. It would also put the University firmly in step with the global movement to retain and adapt existing buildings, by strengthening and renewing them.

Architect Rob Tse, who worked on the design, says, "Renewing these flats makes sense from so many angles; more affordable, faster, better for the environment with much less impact on neighbours too."

"This design would use over 90% less carbon and we cannot see how the demolition of GWF plus a brand-new building to accommodate 500 students on this site would be more cost effective than the strengthening and refurbishment of the existing building/s."

Paul Harvey, President of the Architectural Centre, it is keen to explore with VUW an alternative plan to its outmoded plan to demolish GWF.

"There is a much better way - and that is to make use of the core building: reuse, renew and restore," says Paul Harvey.

Life cycle analysis (LCA) commissioned from the Capana Group

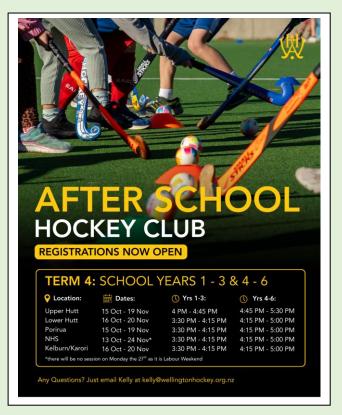
https://www.capanagroup.com/ shows that partial retention of the building and refurbishment with a mass timber seismic structure would result in a 92% reduction in upfront carbon emissions, compared to full demolition and a new concrete building. The full life-cycle analysis estimates an 88% reduction in carbon over the extended lifetime of the building by refurbishing rather than demolishing and building a new one. 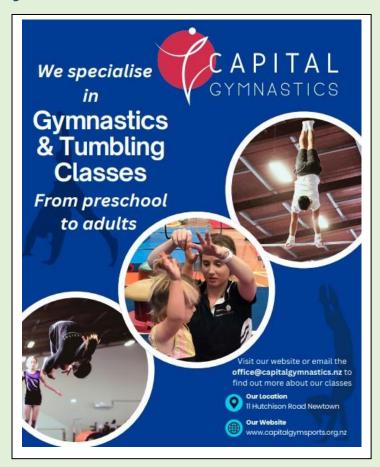
